

Workplace and staff safety

Visualize a patient in a room to enter safely

Challenges

- Nursing staff in psychiatric centre are more likely to be the victims of assaultive behavior on in-patient units (64%) than are other clinical (20%) or non-clinical staff (23%) ⁽¹⁾
- Example of German-speaking regions Switzerland: Psychiatric caregivers experienced 28% physical violence and 14% physical sexual violence.
- Nearly 30% of caregivers in the study had suffered a serious assault during their professional lives. ⁽²⁾

Benefits

- Helps identify a risk for the caregiver by providing a global view of what's happening in the room.
- Helps staff members feel secure



The caregiver activates the camera in the isolation room from his smartphone.



So, he can quickly and safely find out what's going on in the room.



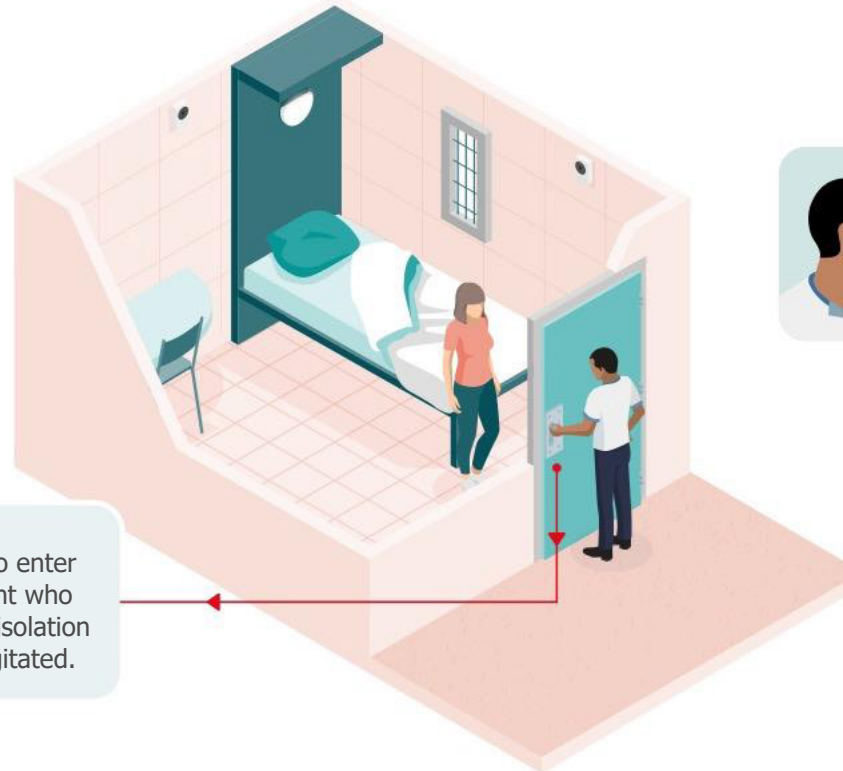
The caregiver can ask the patient to move aside so that he can come inside, before asking for help if necessary.



A caregiver needs to enter the room of a patient who has been placed in isolation because she was agitated.



The patient steps back. The caregiver can then safely enter the room and attend to the patient's needs.



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
